## **Peer Review**

Consistent with the process used by scholarly journals, each new *GeneReview* is reviewed by two to four experts on the disorder who check the entry for accuracy, completeness, and clinical relevance. Reviewers are anonymous to authors.

# **Updates**

Every four to five years, *GeneReview* chapter author(s) and *GeneReviews* editorial staff undertake a comprehensive review of chapter content and format to ensure its currency and continuing clinical relevance to diagnosis, patient care, and genetic counseling.

## **Revisions**

Time-critical revisions to a *GeneReview* are initiated by the editorial staff or the author(s) whenever a clinically significant development (e.g., identification of a gene, advances in treatment) needs to be published.
